Summary:

Under the direction of the Exhibitions Manager, this position provides project-based art handling expertise for exhibitions and collection displays following museum best practices. Assists in receiving and releasing of incoming and outgoing exhibition shipments, packing, unpacking, gallery preparation, exhibition installation and deinstallation, and maintenance.

Responsibilities:

- Art handling throughout the museum galleries, storage vault, and exhibition preparation areas. Responsible for safe art handling in all installs, deinstalls, transport, packing and unpacking artwork as assigned.
- Performs installation/de-installation of exhibitions under the direction of the Exhibitions Manager.
- Assists with incoming and outgoing shipments including packing/unpacking and transfer to storage or exhibition spaces under the direction of the Exhibitions Manager.
- Performs additional tasks as needed.

Qualifications:

2 years of Art handling and art installation experience in a museum or gallery required; ability to lift 25 lbs. comfortably and work with basic tools; mount making a plus; ability to operate equipment; follow instructions precisely, work well under pressure and meet deadlines, be highly detail-oriented, show good judgement, demonstrate initiative, and have strong organizational and multitasking skills. Willing to wear PPE as required.
